STARS GERMAN "HOTSPOTS" TOUR

Sunday 2nd to Sunday 9th July 2023

A week in Germany visiting rail "Hotspots" Frankfurt a.d. Main, Wurzburg & Fulda

Sunday 2ndJuly saw me & 3 others waiting at Bristol Parkway Stn. for a coach to take us & 20 fellow rail enthusiasts on a week's tour in central Germany. The main aim of the tour was to visit Wurzburg & Fulda to observe the many freight trains that pass through these busy "Hotspots", with other places of interest to spice the week up and increase the number tally and photo opportunities.

The coach arrived at 16.30 and we were off, via an Irish Ferries service from Dover to Calais, then on towards Germany. The plan was for a refreshment/comfort break at Aachener Land services but, apart from the petrol station, the facilities were closed. The decision was made to go to Stolberg Station for a break and, as we were well ahead of our schedule, we could view passing traffic on the Aachen to Koln main line. The problem with this idea was that the main line was shut, and a bus re-placement service was in use. However, we were able to use the station café, much to the surprise of the two ladies serving when 20+ British "spotters "appeared at 06.00hrs! Having been fed & watered we carried on to our first port of call, Bw. Koln Gremberg, where permission was gained to view the stabled locos so long as we crossed no lines. We then moved a few hundred yds down the road to the Rbf. to observe the locos there. The 2 locations produced about 35 locos between them, including a few privateers, so we were off to a good start.

We returned to the autobahn, heading for Frankfurt, but on the way called in at Montabaur Stn. to view the stabling point. 4 locos & a departmental were here so it was worth the brief diversion, then it was on towards Frankfurt. On arrival at the Inter City Hotel, conveniently located next to the Hbf., most people dropped their suitcases and went onto the station platforms to start their observations in earnest.

The activity was almost nonstop, with continuous arrivals & departures. There was an interesting variety of units, both DB & privateer, ICEs of all generations and both diesel & electric locomotives making appearances during the afternoon and evening. The units included examples powered by diesel, electric & hydrogen. At least 2 French TGVs were seen, plus an Italian ETR.610 Pendolino. 2 class 218 "Rabbits" were parked in the station for use as rescue locos should the need arise. For the unit bashers an hour downstairs on the S-Bahn filled a few more pages in their books.

Monday morning a relatively late start allowed those who wished to observe the rush hour before we left for Bw. Mainz Bischofsheim. We had an accompanied tour of the depot and although we could not go inside the workshops, we could see all the numbers through doors, so we missed nothing. Next on the list was Bw. Mannheim. Permission was gained for us to walk along the private road that runs beside the depot, and we were able to view the locos parked outside from the footbridge that crosses the running lines south-east of the yard. Luck was on our side as, because of the excessive heat, the depot doors were open wide, and we were able to get everything inside. More than 65+ locos were observed here and when we passed Mannheim Hbf. a few minutes later another 15+ plus numbers were added. Heilbronn Hbf. was next with 9 units & 1 loco seen, plus some tram-trains.

We now headed to Wurzburg where we were stopping for 2 nights. Once booked into the Hotel Strauss, which is in the middle of the town, we walked the 10-15 mins. to the Hbf. where 24 British gricers invaded the platforms. The evening was busy with plenty of freight movements, giving us a taste of what to expect on Wednesday, the first of our "free" days.

Wednesday was another hot day and found everyone on the station for what was one of the main reasons for the tour. The constant stream of freights kept us busy as did the passenger traffic. There are a lot of crew changes carried out in the station resulting in up to 4 freights waiting for a route out at any one time. This results in some freights passing behind trains already in the station making photography difficult at times. The width of the station also causes problems so some of us decided to travel north about 40 kms to Gemunden (Main) where the opportunities are better for unobstructed-ted photos. All the freights pass through here but none of the ICEs. After about 4 hrs we returned to Wurzburg happy with the results. During the day we saw around 100 freights plus passenger traffic, a good day by anyone's standards.

Thursday morning found us back on the Hbf for a few more hours before we boarded the coach heading for pastures new. Wurzburg-Zell s.p. was our first stop where 4 locos were found, then on to Schweinfurt. Here we went onto the station where a loco and 7 units were seen, including 2 new DB 1462s. Next stop was the STB unit depot & station at Meiningen which were viewed from the yard between the two. 10+ units & a former DB 218 were observed. We then visited Au. Meiningen, the DB workshops that specialise in new build steam boilers & repairs. For those that visited here in past years it was probably a disappointment, as the workforce has dropped from around 4,000 people in its heyday to about 180 employees today, but it was nonetheless a fascinating visit. Apart from the expected steam locos being worked on there were some diesels, as well as the boiler for the new build P2 being built by the A1 trust in Britain. Also, the 1935 built replica of "Adler", the first German railway locomotive used commercially, was present undergoing a major overhaul. From here we had a 2-hour run to our hotel at Fulda. Once booked into the Invite Hotel most people went straight to Fulda Hbf, 5 mins. away, for an evening of freight spotting.

Friday was our second "free day" with everyone able to follow their own agenda, most people choosing to stay at Fulda to observe the procession of freights that pass through almost non-stop. There was a lull of about an hour at one point due to a lineside fire somewhere but otherwise it did not disappoint. This time five of us took advantage of a group ticket and travelled half an hour up the line to Bebra where we found around 20 locos stabled & working. We returned to Fulda and spent another busy evening there.

Saturday morning our first stop was Limberg Hbf. We picked off everything in the station & yard including the plinthed Kof on the roundabout outside, then travelled the short distance to view the depot through the fence. The tally was 7 locos and 14 units, so it was another worthwhile location. Next was a visit to the DB museum at Koblenz. With our 4-euro entrance fee paid we were able to view everything at a leisurely pace. The only disappointment here was the lack of refreshment facilities. Most exhibits were diesel or electric with a handful of steam locos thrown in for good measure. 50+ items and some passing traffic added to the list. We then travelled to the Trans Regio depot in Koblenz where we viewed 3 units from across the tracks. At this location it required some deft manoeuvring by our drivers who performed all tasks asked of them during the tour with no complaints despite some awkward situations. From here it was an hour's drive to the Nikki City Hotel at Leverkusen.

Sunday was the start of our long journey home with Bw. Koln Gremberg the first stop. A friendly response in the office resulted in permission to walk around the stabled locos and another 45+ were in the bag. Aachen West Gbf. was next with 12 locos seen, followed quickly by Aachen Hbf. & depot viewed from the bridge between the two. This took longer than expected due to roadworks in the town, but the drivers were nothing if not patient and we got there in the end. 2 DB 146s, an ICE & some units were mopped up, including a Dutch Arriva set.

At this point the trip was effectively over, and it should have been an uncomplicated journey to Calais. We joined the motorway & headed through Belgium, seeing 2 SNCB locos from the coach before stopping in services for fuel. We left the services and had been travelling for 45 mins. when it was noticed that one of our party was missing. This of course meant us having to retrace our journey and

return to the services. This resulted in us losing the time we had gained by leaving earlier than planned in the morning, plus we were at least another half hour behind. Luckily our missing man had stayed put and he saw us arrive to pick him up. Off we went again heading for Calais. We crossed into France and passed the yard at Grande-Synthe where there were 3 locos. Fifteen minutes later we arrived at Calais ferry port where we passed 1 last loco in the yard near the entrance. This is where the "fun" began. In front of us were about 10 coaches, some full of teenagers and some whose passengers would not have looked out of place crossing in a dinghy. The French authorities, never missing a chance to inconvenience us Brits, were grossly understaffed. We then had to contend with the British Border Force who appeared to be out of their depth, so no change there then. The result of all this was that it took more than 90 minutes to clear customs, and we arrived on the dock side in time to see our ferry leaving. Luckily Irish Ferries put us on the next boat which was leaving in 90 mins. By the time we arrived home we had clawed some time back and we were about 45 minutes behind schedule.

Overall, the tour went down well & certainly justified the "Hotspots" title. Hopefully more trips that include the "hotspots" theme can be arranged in the future.
